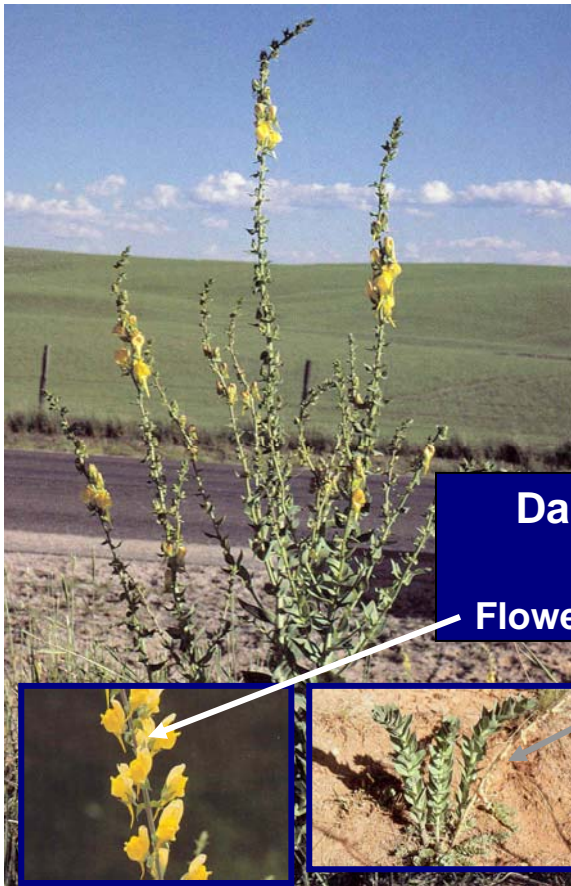


Toadflaxes are Perennial members of the figwort family. They are extremely aggressive and can spread from both seed and roots. Both varieties have two tone yellowish flowers similar to snapdragons, hence their common name – Butter and Eggs. They can become very problematic crowding out desirable grasses therefore reducing forage for wildlife.



Dalmatian Toadflax is a native of SE Europe that grows to 3' tall and has waxy succulent leaves. It sets rosettes in the fall for spring bloom and can practically continue growing throughout the year, especially with Colorado's temperate Front Range weather.
